NOVEMBER 05, 2009 FALSE CREEK COMMUNITY ENERGY CENTRE Ray Tarnal, P.Eng., Sandwell Engineering Inc.

The False Creek Community Energy Centre, located at the south end of Cambie Bridge, is an environmentally friendly Neighbourhood Energy Utility that will deliver hot water for space heating and domestic hot water to a number of buildings located within the Southeast False Creek (Olympic Village) area. The facility will be the first in North America to utilize municipal wastewater and heat pump technology as the primary heat source, supplemented with natural gas fired boilers. Ray will speak about the engineering, architecture, public art, landscaping and sustainability issues involved in developing a solution that is appealing to the general public from both an environmental and aesthetic perspective.

DECEMBER 03, 2009 CANAPORT - SAINT JOHN, NEW BRUNSWICK
Neal D. Coffin, P.Eng., Sandwell Engineering Inc.

Canaport LNG is constructing a state-of-the-art liquefied natural gas (LNG) receiving and regasification terminal in Saint John, New Brunswick. The facility will be the first LNG regasification plant in Canada and will supply natural gas to Canadian and American markets. The initial send-out capacity (the ability to distribute via pipeline) will be 28 million cubic meters (1.2 billion cubic feet) of natural gas per day. Canaport LNG is proud to bring safe, clean energy to the Saint John community and beyond. They are also proud to employ a local workforce and contract to local companies to contribute to the continued economic development of the community. The talk will be on the design and construction of the Marine Terminal.

JANUARY 07, 2010 THE PRICELESS GIFT - CALGARY '88 OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES Frank King, P.Eng., Chairman and CEO, OCO '88

Frank King is best known in sports and community circles as the Chairman and CEO of the "best-ever Olympic Winter Games". The unprecedented financial success of the Calgary '88 Olympic Games has resulted in a permanent legacy of sports facilities, funding and people all dedicated to the development of young Canadian athletes. Among his many awards and accolades, Frank was named as an Officer of the Order of Canada and is a recipient of the International Olympic Committee's Gold Olympic Order. Frank's presentation will address the project and engineering management challenges he faced in achieving the unprecedented financial and volunteer success of the Calgary '88 Olympic Games.

There will be no February Luncheon due to the Olympic schedule. For our March Luncheon we are hoping to have Robert Allen address us on Tug Design for the oil businesses around the world; and for the April Luncheon possibly Penny Cochrane of Willis Energy, speaking on the IPP industry and the recent controversy over the BCUC decision on BC Hydro's Long Term Acquisition Plan and the government's response in the Throne Speech. This deals with BC Hydro's ability to buy power from the IPP industry and with respect to the future use of Burrard Thermal.
